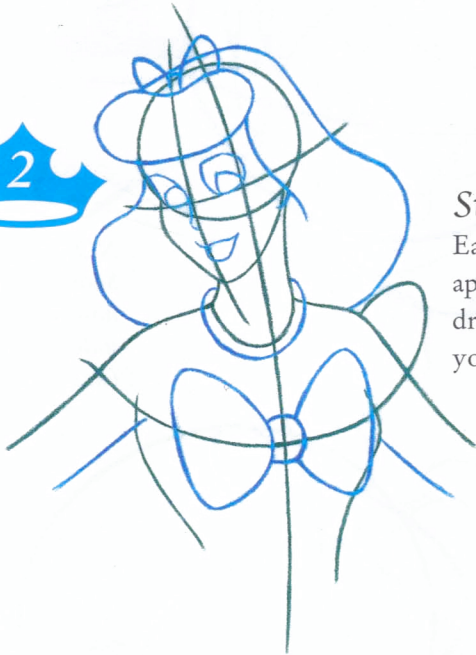
How to Use This Book

You can draw any princess by following the simple steps in this book. You'll be amazed at how fun and easy drawing can be!



Step 1

Start your drawings in the middle of your paper so you don't run out of room.



Step 2

Each new step appears in blue, so draw all the blue lines you see.



Step 3

Refine the lines of your drawing and add the details.



Step 4

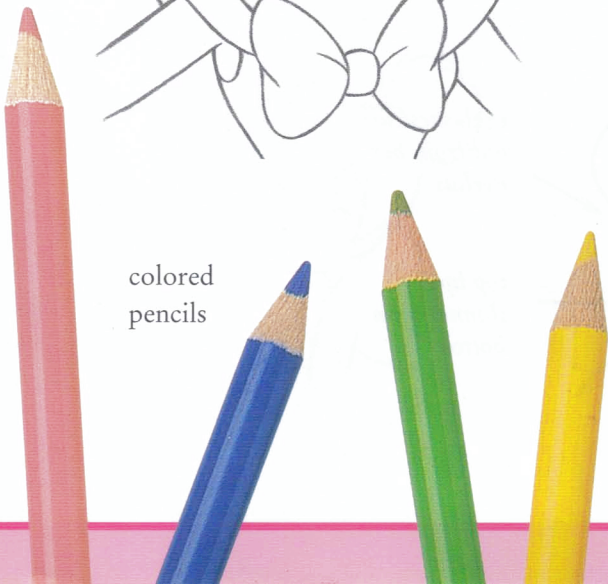
Darken the lines you want to keep and erase the rest.



Step 5

Add some beautiful colors to make your drawing really come alive!

Snow White

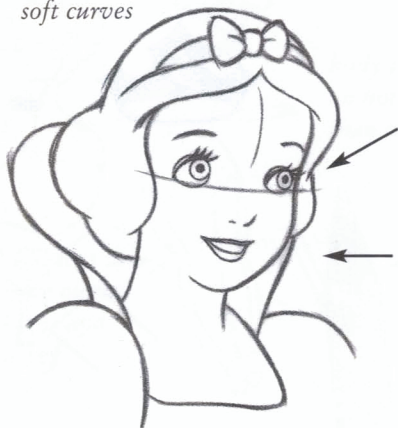
Snow White is a beautiful young princess who is badly mistreated by her wicked stepmother, the Queen. When creating Snow White, Walt Disney decided to make his first feature princess look more like a pretty “girl next door” than like a glamorous princess. Snow White does have rose-red lips, ebony hair, and skin as white as snow that win her the title of “fairest one of all.” But her rounded face and figure also show her youth and innocence.

Snow White's hair is drawn with soft curves



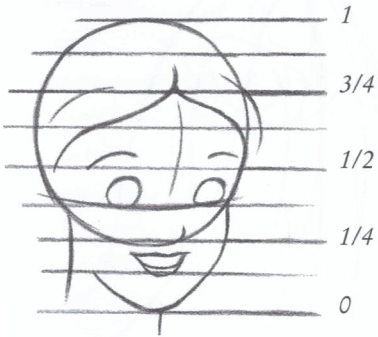
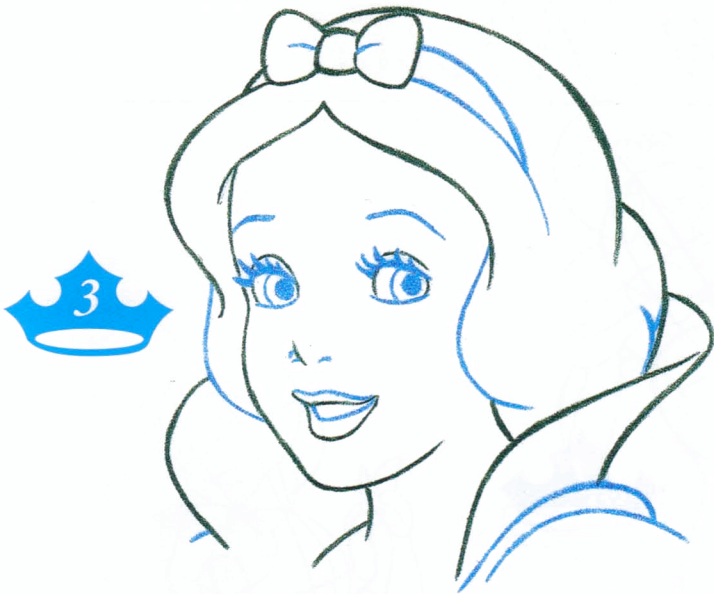

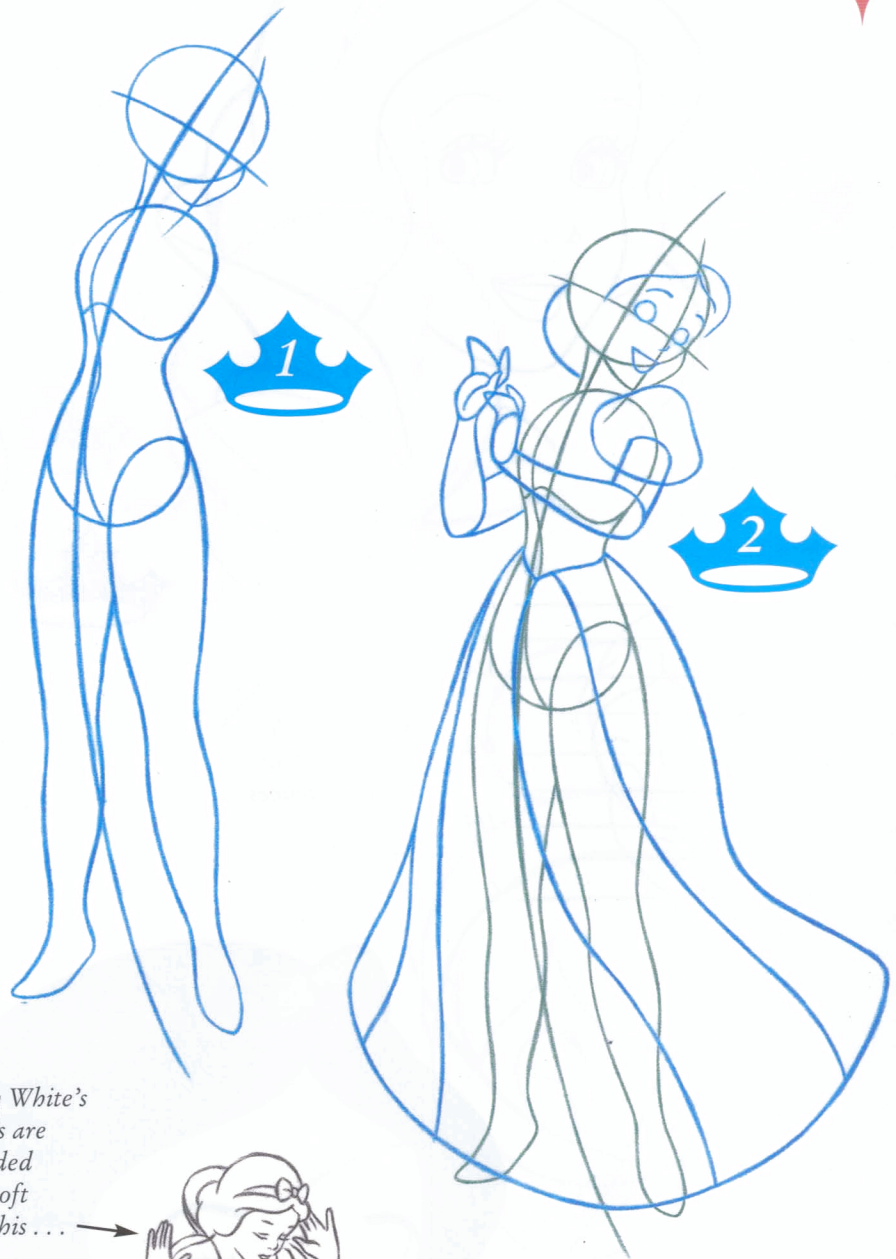


Snow White's features follow these guidelines



Snow White

Even when she's abandoned in the forest, Snow White's kindness shines through and wins her the friendship of all the forest animals—as well as the love and loyalty of all of the Seven Dwarfs. When you draw Snow White, be sure to show the soft, sweeping lines in her dress and the gentle arm movements that emphasize her cheerful, sweet disposition and her joy for life.

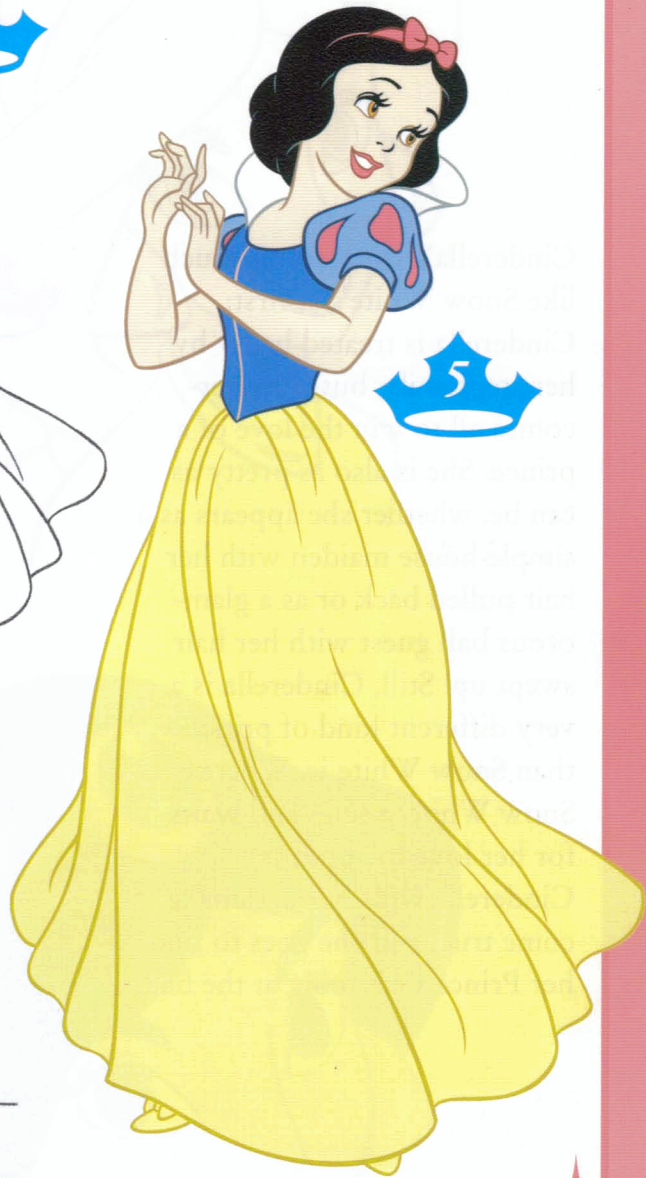
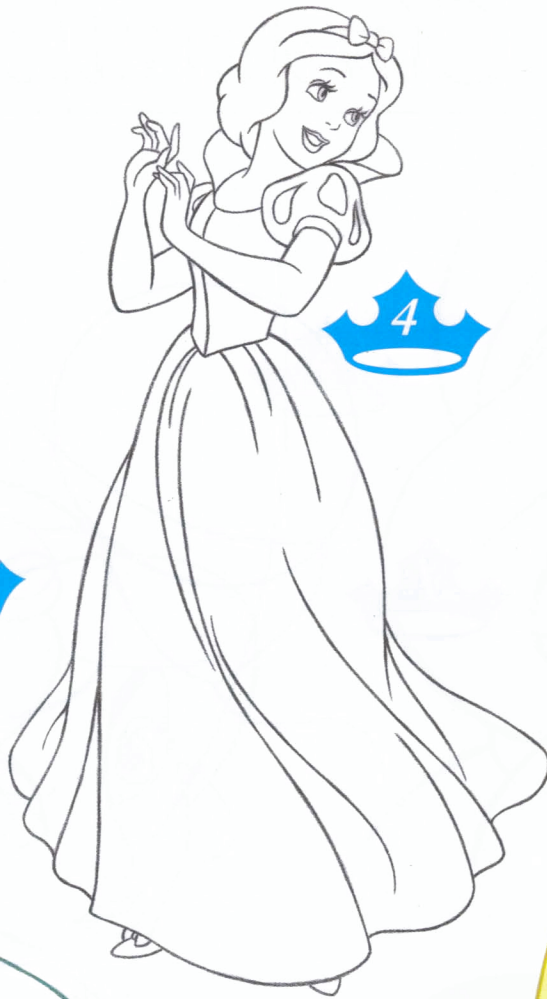

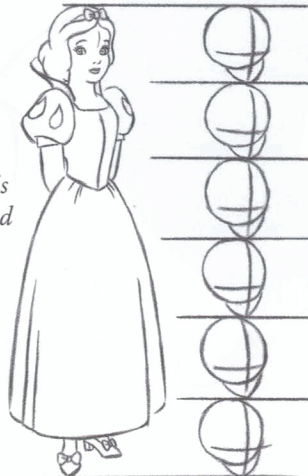

Cinderella

Cinderella's story seems much like Snow White's at first: Cinderella is treated badly by her stepfamily, but she overcomes all to win the love of a prince. She is also as pretty as can be, whether she appears as a simple house maiden with her hair pulled back or as a glamorous ball guest with her hair swept up. Still, Cinderella is a very different kind of princess than Snow White is. Whereas Snow White wishes and waits for her love to appear, Cinderella wills her dreams to come true, and she goes to find her Prince Charming at the ball.



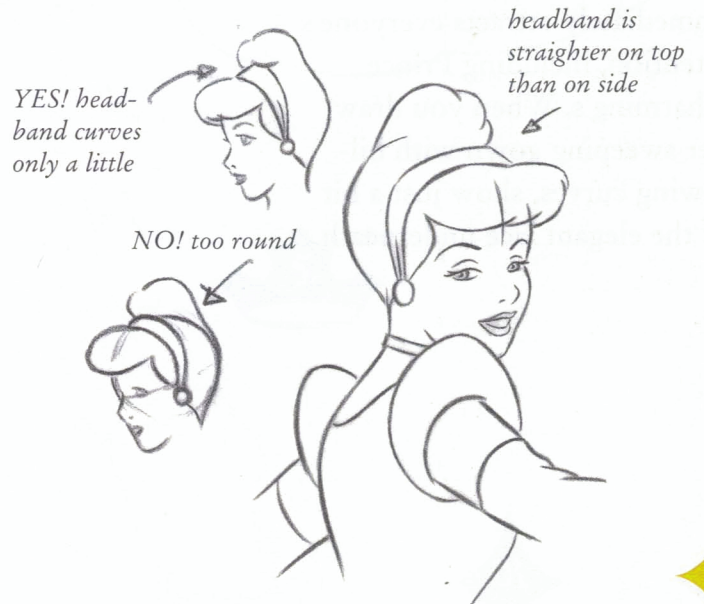
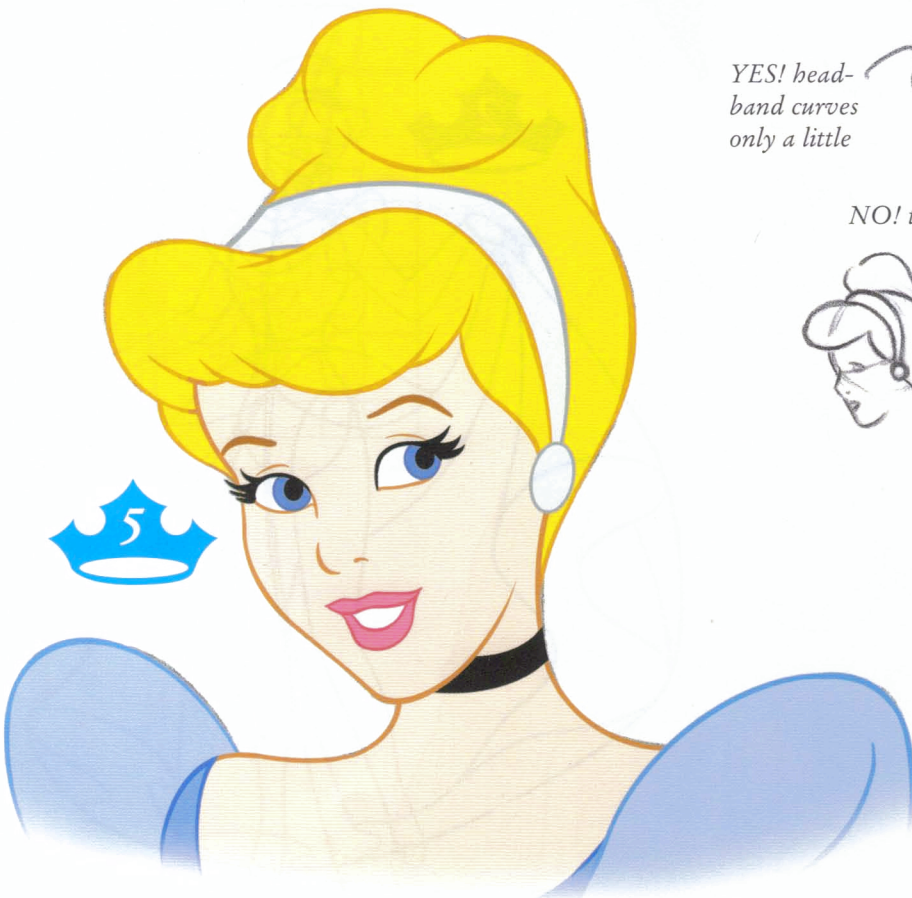

Cinderella

Cinderella's beauty and graceful movements are evident as she runs down the stairs in her simple, homemade gown, but they are even more obvious at the ball. When she first arrives in her gorgeous dress (thanks to her Fairy Godmother), she immediately attracts everyone's attention, including Prince Charming's. When you draw her sweeping gown with billowing curves, show just a bit of the elegant lace underneath.

Sleeping Beauty

Though 16-year-old Princess Aurora has been gifted with beauty, she looks very different from both Snow White and Cinderella. She appears older—more like a woman than like a young girl. Princess Aurora spends the early years of her life in the forest as the “peasant” Briar Rose, where she wears a simple dress and holds back her wavy, waist-length hair with a headband. This is how she looks when she first meets Prince Phillip.

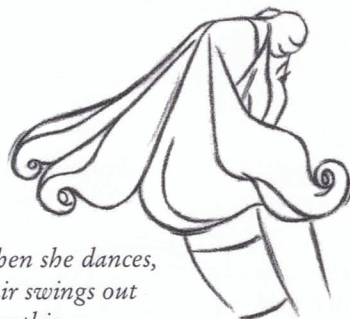


Sleeping Beauty

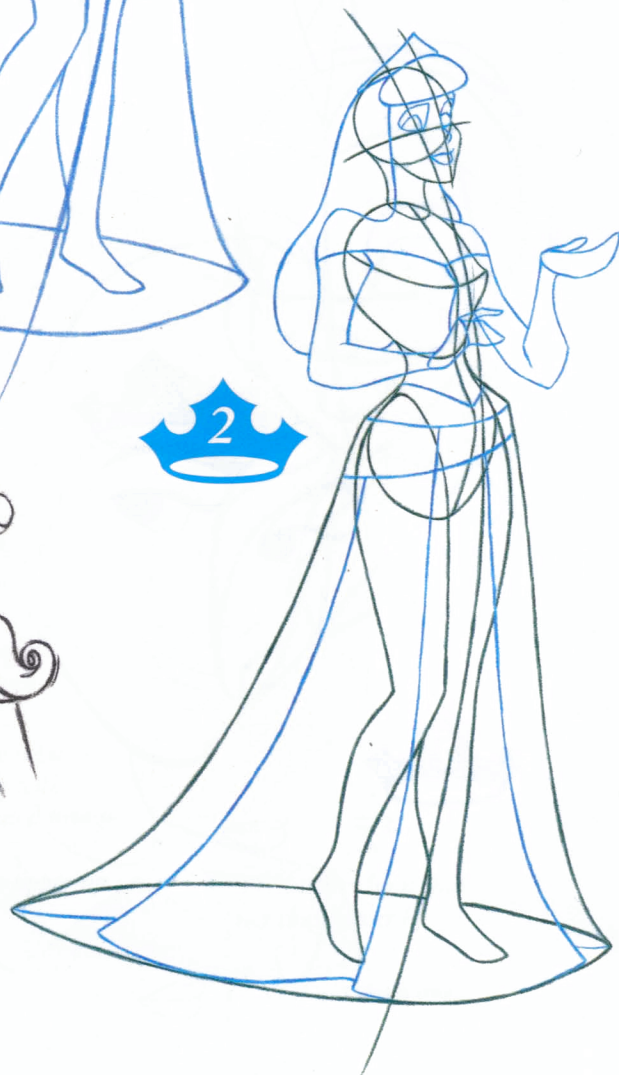
When Aurora is awakened from her sleep by a kiss from Prince Phillip, she is saved from the curse placed upon her at birth—and she gets to marry her true love! Now when she dances with her prince in the palace, her simple dress is exchanged for a lovely gown, and a beautiful tiara replaces her plain headband. Use long, slightly curved lines for her skirt to show how regal this princess has become.

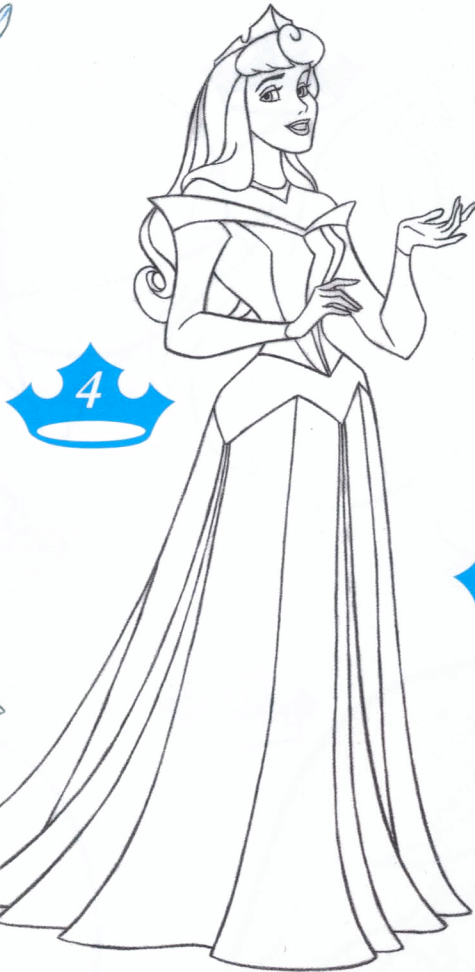
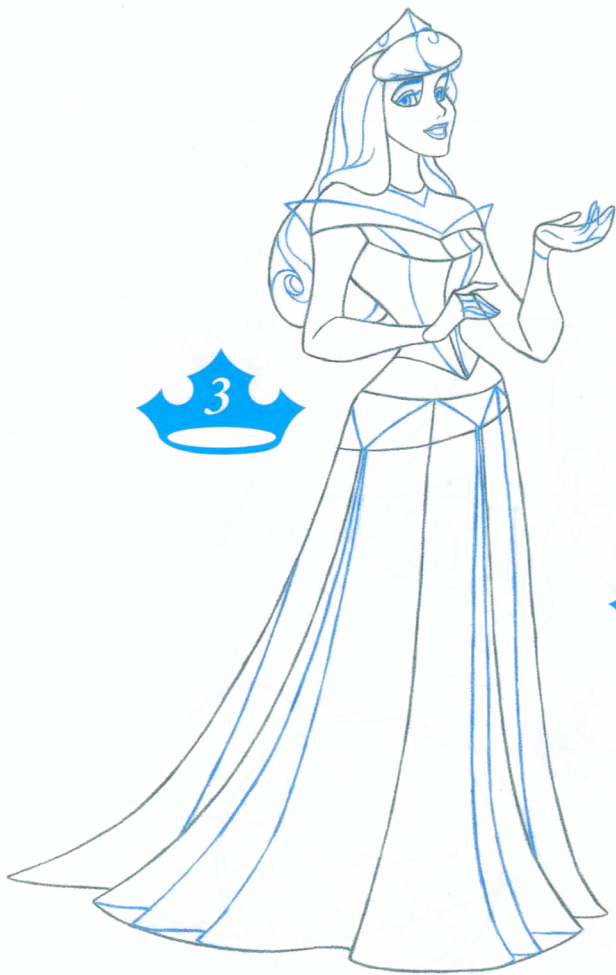


Sleeping Beauty's hair curls like this at the back

Ariel

In many ways, *The Little Mermaid's* Ariel starts out as a very different character from Snow White, Cinderella, or Aurora. She is a confident, headstrong, and passionate teenager who knows exactly what she wants—and will do anything to get it. In fact, she is a princess among princesses, with no fewer than six royal sisters! Ariel lives with her sisters and her father, King Triton, under the sea in Atlantica. And her wavy red hair—a new hair color for a Disney princess—flows with the currents in her underwater kingdom.

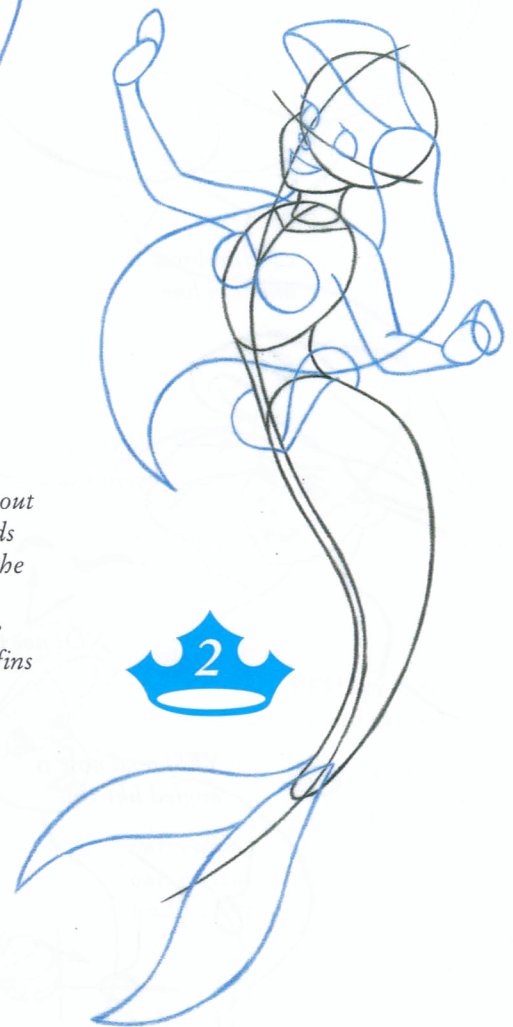
Ariel

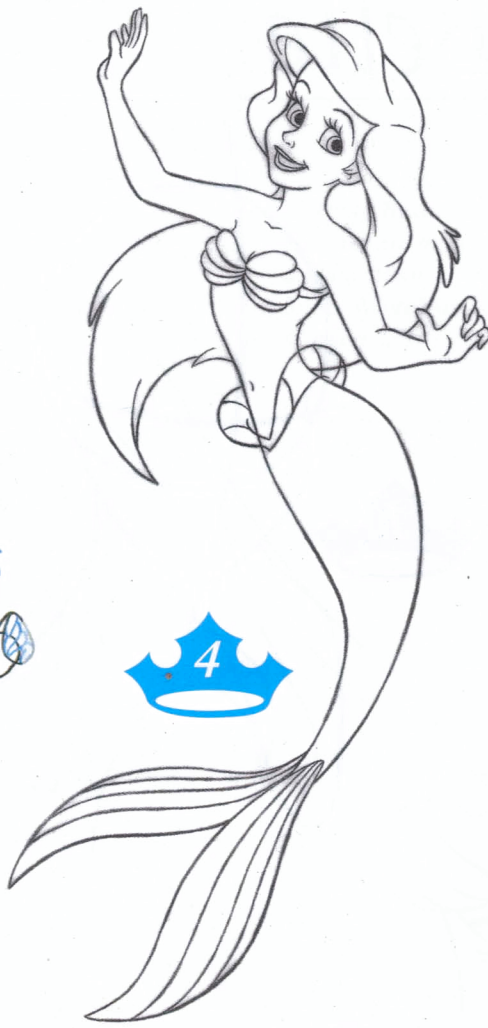

But even without speaking, she's able to win the heart of Prince Eric. Try drawing her as we first meet her, wearing her seashell mermaid outfit and swimming freely under the sea.

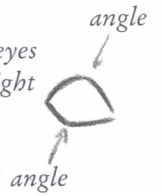
Belle

Beauty and the Beast's Belle may like to read and daydream about princes and princesses, but she doesn't live the life of royalty. And she certainly isn't looking for a prince—especially if the closest thing to a “prince” in her town is the conceited Gaston! Down-to-earth Belle keeps her brown hair pulled back in a simple ponytail as she leads a “normal life” in her small, provincial town. Her large, almond-shaped eyes capture the sense of wonder and excitement she feels about new ideas and new places.

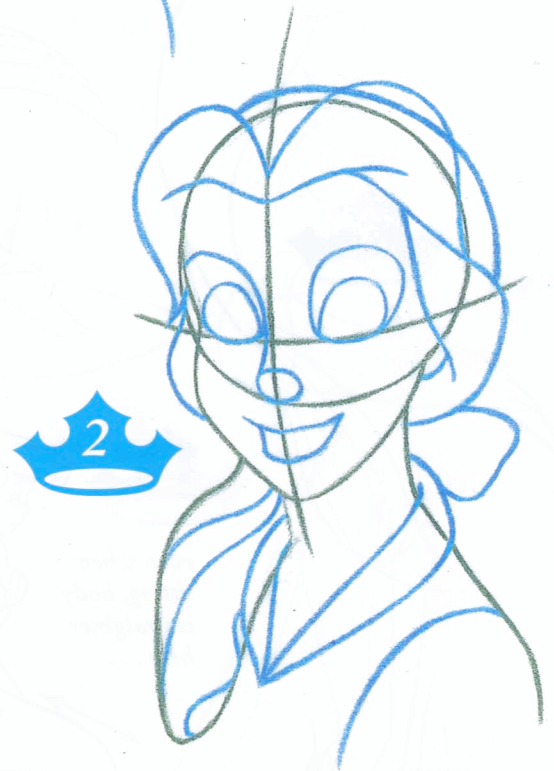

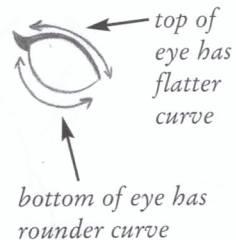
Jasmine

Like Aurora, *Aladdin's* Jasmine is about to have her fateful 16th birthday at the beginning of her story. But while Aurora's fairy "aunts" kept hopeful princes away, Jasmine's father hopes that his daughter will marry one of the many princes who come to see her. But Jasmine has other ideas. She would rather marry for love—and she chooses the handsome, young street thief, Aladdin. Jasmine's dramatic features emphasize her exotic beauty, making her unique among the Disney princesses.

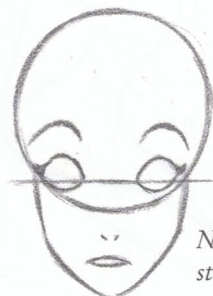

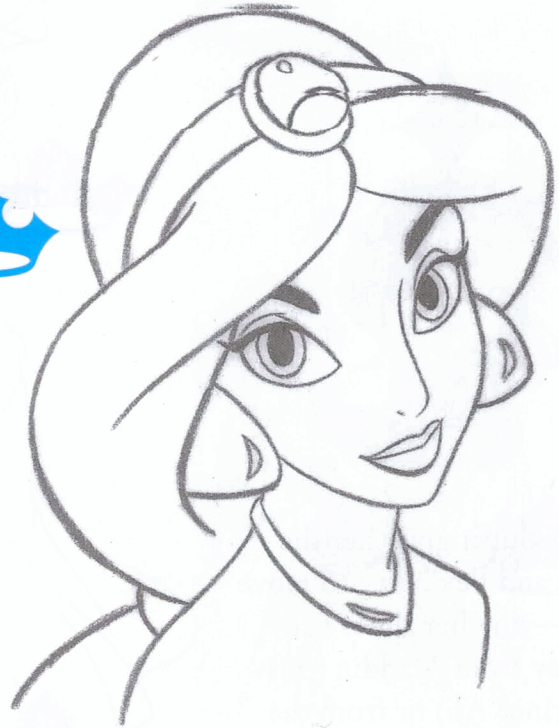

Jasmine

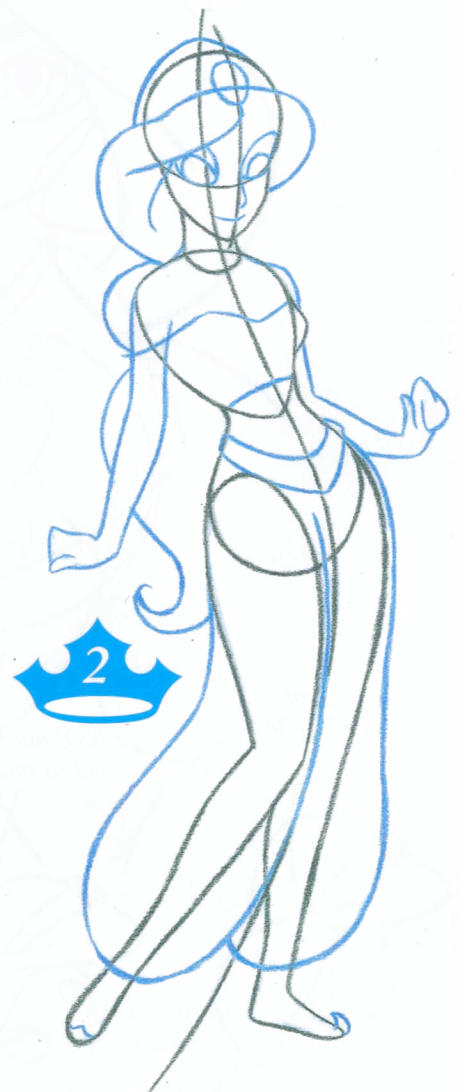

Be sure to draw the sparkling jewel in her headband and the curled toes of her delicate slippers.

Tinker Bell's pixie look is carried through in her hair style: Her bangs hang low on her forehead, and she wears a little bun on top of her head.

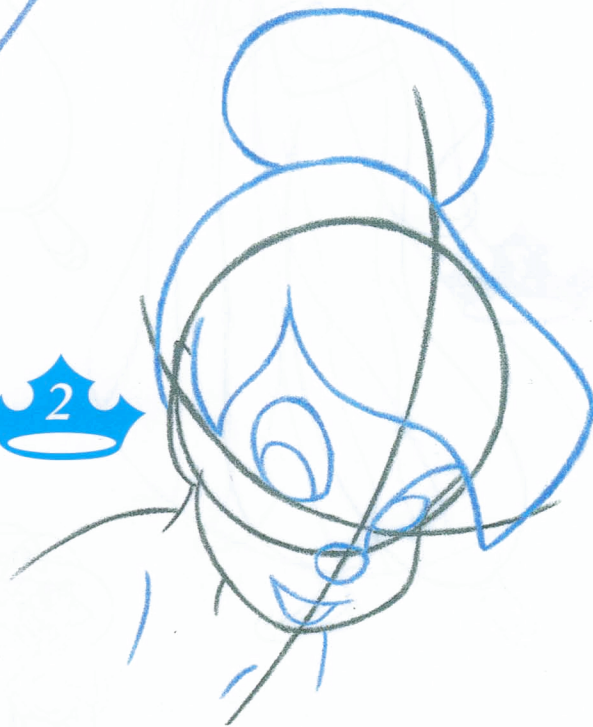

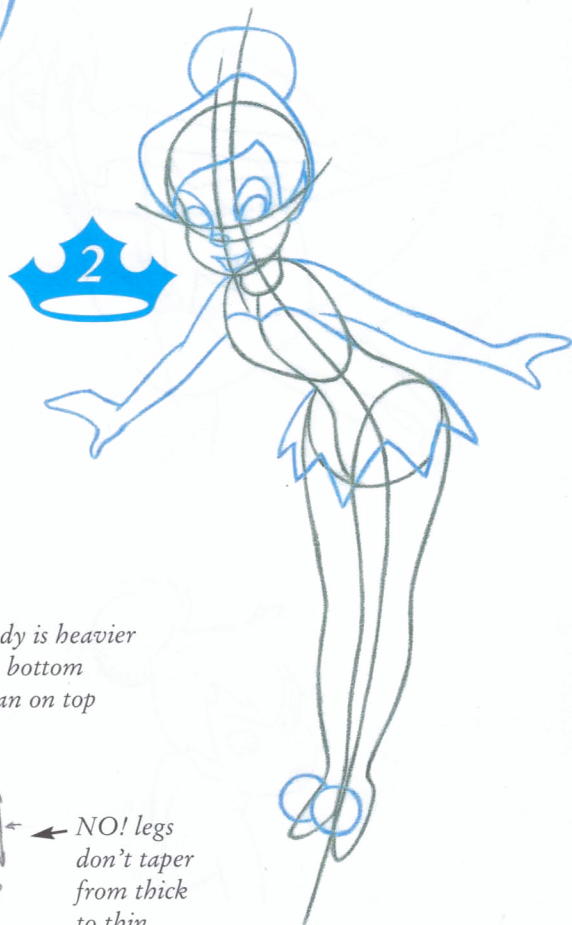
Tinker Bell

Her tiny costume adds to her pixie look and helps her fly about freely. But don't forget to draw her wings—she couldn't fly without them!
